

Obsession with crime & punishment



When corporations always win, democracy weakens. Trump's tax law showers benefits on the wealthy, while his appointees make it harder to unionize and easier for employers to exploit and silence workers.

Rampant sexism


Authoritarian politics rely on rigid gender roles and contempt for women's autonomy. Trump's record includes the "Access Hollywood" tape, many sexual assault allegations, and relentless attacks on reproductive rights and gender equality.

Disdain for intellectuals & the arts

Fascism feeds on anti-intellectualism. Trump mocks scientists and experts, sidelines public health guidance, threatens funding for critical art, and pushes propaganda over honest research and culture.




Religion & government intertwined



Fascist movements use faith as a political weapon. Under Trump, Christian nationalism has galloped. Religious liberty is invoked to justify anti-LGBT+ policies, and conservative religious leaders shape the courts and public policy.

Glorification of the military & obsession with national security



Trump has pushed for grand parades, pardoned war criminals, elevated TV pundits to key posts, and cut support for many military families. While ignoring real threats, he pushes in uniformed authoritarians wrap themselves in uniforms while ignoring real needs. Trump's isolationism is used to justify racism and xenophobia.

Rampant cronyism & corruption




Authoritarians blur the line between public office and private profit. Trump steers events to his own pockets, installs family and loyalists in key roles, and uses the presidency to reward allies and promote his businesses.

Disdain for human rights



Fascism treats as optional, especially as traitors. "enemy of the people," and frames opponents as "garbage" and "vermin," brands the press as "enemies. Warning Signs of Fascism



Authoritarianism rarely arrives all at once. It creeps in, one "exceptional" policy at a time, while people are told it's all normal, or necessary, or temporary. When we can see the pattern, we can organize sooner, protect each other, and push our country in a different direction.

Controlled mass media

You don't always need formal censorship. Trump's constant cries of "fake news" and "enemy of the people," plus threats to licenses and mergers, work to bully journalists and trap supporters inside a closed media bubble.



Fraudulent elections

A classic fascist move is to attack trust in voting. After losing in 2020, Trump spread lies about "stolen" votes, pressured officials to "find" votes, filed baseless lawsuits, and incited Jan. 6 riots to try to overturn the result. Trump attacks the voter rolls, undermines voting by mail, and encourages destructive redistricting.

How We Fight Back

Fascism is not unstoppable. It depends on people like you looking away or giving up.

We push back when we tell the truth, join local groups, support journalism and public institutions, vote in every election, and organize so no one faces this alone. Authoritarians fear us standing together.



They want us isolated and afraid. Our power is in showing up together, again and again. We can do it.
